


Your profile includes your diagnosis, demographics, and treatment information. When you are registered and logged in, click the My Profile link.




If you start your session as a Guest, the information you enter in the short series of questions will automatically be added to your profile.







You can add or update your profile details by hovering and clicking the pencil icon.



Your treatment history information plays an important role in determining whether you are eligible for a trial. For example, some trials require that you have received a certain number or type of prior treatments, while other trials are for people who have not yet received any treatment for metastatic breast cancer.










Let's walk through the process of adding your prior medications for metastatic breast cancer to your MTS profile. Don't worry about entering your medications in chronological order; MTS will arrange them for you.



For example, let's say you have hormone receptor positive, HER2 negative metastatic breast cancer and your first treatment included hormone therapy and a CDK inhibitor taken together.

On your MTS profile, you can enter this information by clicking "add a line of therapy."


A line of therapy refers to all medications taken at the same time. You can click "add or edit medication" to add the two drugs you took together for this line of therapy. If the treatment you received was a combination drug or a regimen, which is more than one drug received at the same time, be sure to input each individual drug into this line of therapy. You can always consult your doctor for more information about the drugs you have received.







For this example, let's add Femara, a hormone therapy, and Ibrance, a CDK inhibitor. If you know their brand names, you could start by typing "Femara" and "Ibrance". Or you could search by their generic names, "Letrozole" and "Palbociclib".



You can also sort by brand names and generic names to see the drugs in alphabetical order, or you can sort by category if you can't remember the name of the drugs. If you have any questions about the drugs you've taken, be sure to check your medical records or ask your doctor.

Click "add" for each drug to include them in this line of therapy.




Click "apply" to confirm the medications in this line of therapy. Next, you will enter whether you are currently on the treatment.







Input the start date for the medication, and if you are no longer on the treatment include the end date. These dates can be estimated; they do not have to be exact.



You will also be asked if your cancer progressed while on these drugs. Now click "apply" again to complete this line of therapy.










Once you have finished adding all prior lines of therapy, you can add the treatment that you are currently taking. This is a new line of therapy, so click "Add line of therapy" again.



For this example, let's say you are currently receiving Abraxane chemotherapy.


Once you click "apply", simply click the button that says you're currently on this therapy, and enter the start date.







What if you participated in a clinical trial as a line of therapy?



When choosing the medication, select "Experimental" as a drug option. If you also received any standard of care drugs in the clinical trial, be sure to add them to the line of therapy as well. If you don't see the name of a drug you received, you can select "Other".







In this example, you have now completed your drug treatment history.

Finish your health profile by entering any radiation or surgery you've received for metastatic breast cancer. You can also enter any medications you received for your initial breast cancer diagnosis.

To make things easier, the system does not require you to input dates for your earlier treatment since only the types of drugs you've received affect your current trial eligibility.
